

# EYE EXAMS

and why they are important for academic success!

## 80% of classroom learning relies on vision. Undetected vision issues can lead to:

- Decreased academic performance
- Lowered self-esteem
- Difficulty reading
- Reduced participation
- Poor social interactions



## COMPREHENSIVE EYE EXAMS

- Conducted by optometrists
- Assess overall eye health and vision.
- Detect conditions that screenings might overlook.



#### VISION SCREENINGS

(at schools or pediatricians office)

Quick checks fail to identify many underlying vision issues.





- 1st Exam: At 6 months old
- 2nd Exam: At 3 years old
- Before 1st Grade: Around age 5 or 6
- Annually: Every year after

#### TALKING TO AN OPTOMETRIST

- Optometrists provide primary eye health care
- Early diagnosis + treatment are essential to prevent vision problems from worsening over time
- Parents are encouraged to schedule annual eye exams to ensure their children are set up for success before the school year
